Learn culinary skills while making an assortment of dishes, from healthy choices to delicious treats.



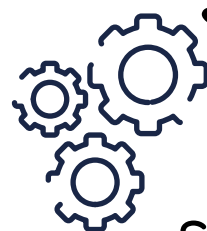
Garden Club

Book Club

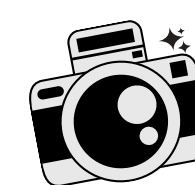
Members will read books together and participate in activities and discussions relating to the books.
